

# **TIME AND DATES**

The doors are open and children are welcome into school from 8.45am.

We run a free breakfast club from 8.15am. Children wishing to attend breakfast club need to arrive between 8:15am and 8.25am.

### **ATTENDANCE**

It is very important for pupils to be in school every day if they are to achieve. The school works hard to ensure children are in school. The school keeps records of pupil absence and lateness and works closely with the Education Welfare Service to support families who are experiencing difficulties in this area.

The school shares an <u>Attendance Policy</u> with other schools within the local cluster to ensure consistency for all children and parents across the area. The policy takes a strong stance on unauthorised absences and parents are fined if their child/ren have more than ten unauthorised absences.

Attendance has decreased over the last three years from 88% to 87.5%.



# SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PRIORITIES 2024/25

### The school is focusing on the following:

- Rich authentic topics, with high pupils engagement, high levels of challenge, stimulating learning environments will ensure our pupils make good progress.
- To raise attendance and parental engagement in education so that children are in school, accessing their learning, and as a result make good progress.
- To ensure excellent health and wellbeing provision
- The curriculum at Meadowlane will give our pupils a variety of opportunities to develop and apply their metacognition, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Skills to a high standard.





# LINKS WITH THE COMMUNITY

Governors ensure the school works closely with the community to support the children's learning and development.

The school works closely with the police and a range of health professionals to support the children in staying safe and healthy.

The school has good links with the Rotary Club, who fund an end of year trip for good attendance, and with the Beacon Centre who provide support for families.

The school is currently working with Lovell and Wates Contractors due to the nearby building developments. They are supporting the school with a Healthy Living event and by working with the children on how to stay safe near building sites.

# OPPORTUNITIES WITHIN SCHOOL

Whole school assemblies are held on Wednesday and Fridays. Key Stage assemblies and class assemblies are held on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Parents are invited to attend class assemblies and other special events during the year.

Visits and experiences are an important part of our curriculum at Meadowlane. Each year, children visit many places to support their learning and learn from visitors to the school too.

Children in Year 6 have the opportunity to take part in residential trips.

Meadowlane take part in the Open Campus programme organised by Cardiff Metropolitan University. It aims to engage pupils in physical activity at the University's facilities at the Cyncoed campus.
